Goal of the corridor re-design  • Promote a street that is multimodal.  • Integrate place-making design concepts.  • Improvements to pedestrian and transit access.  Benefits of project  • Paving, drainage, mid-intersection crosswalks, bike lane, lighting, landscaping, public art, ADA parking spaces, safer parking coordination.
