Sunset Strip

- Complete Streets Pilot Project
 - NW 19th Street to NW 72nd Avenue
- Road Diet Continuation





NW 64th Avenue


- The City applied for a 2014 Transportation Alternatives Program Grant
 - Oakland Park Blvd to Sunset Strip
 - Awarded \$760,000 to assist with funding of the project





NW 44th Street

- The City was awarded a Transportation Enhancement Program Grant
 - Creation of new six-foot wide bike paths, with a two-foot buffer,
 - from Pine Island
 Road to NW 117th Avenue
 - Awarded \$862,000 to assist with construction of the project





Complete Streets Strategy

The City Commission adopted a Resolution (C14193) on July 8, 2014, expressing its commitment to Complete Streets Policies and its practices which help encourage the design, planning and construction of safer, healthier streets to ultimately increase physical activity and improve the health of neighborhoods.



Bicycle Pedestrian Advisory Board

On January 14, 2014 the City Commission amended the City Code to create the BPAB, with the vision to make the City a more bicycle and pedestrian friendly city by integrating pedestrian and bicycle-related policies and programs in the City's planning, development, implementation and programmatic initiatives



Bicycle/Pedestrian Greenways & Trails Master Plan

- On May 27, 2014 the City Commission approved the award of the Master Plan
- The Master Plan will look at the entire City and will be all inclusive
- The Consultant will be presenting the Master Plan to the City Commission and Catabar 28, 2014




Rectangular Rapid Flashing Beacons (RRFB's)






SE 3 Avenue @ SE 1 Street (Fort Lauderdale) Pilot Project




































Bailey Road Mid-Block Crossing with RRFB's




























Commercial Boulevard @ SR-A1A All-Way Pedestrian Phase (Lauderdale-By-The-Sea)

What has been the experience of Broward County cities when it is the duty of the property owner to construct or reconstruct, maintain and keep is good repair the sidewalk abutting their property?






- Broward Complete Streets Guidelines and adapted versions adopted by multiple cities throughout Broward County


